

A Hale Mini-Interview

Subject: Dr. Nancy Mroczek, Ph.D.

Yes, indeed she is an actual doctor folks. Not only does she hold a doctorate in behavior and neuropsychology, she also is the lead singer of a hard-hitting Boston based punk band, which brings her activism and music to "the chumps who need to be learned." We recently got the good doctor to answer a few quick email questions for us:

H: What prompted the delving into music, most specifically the type of music you perform?

N: Loved music all my life; a (natural) (& sort of direct) way of expressing; the music I write is the music that comes out of me. The style can be variable as well.

H: Variable how? As in old school punk one moment to freeform jazz the next? Or not that wide on the spectrum?

N: Variable across the board; least likely (but not out), is classical.

H: As a psychologist, do you take your background on stage to judge the behavior of the audience you're playing for and use that to your advantage to keep them into it?

N: I think I'm more of an ordinary self conscious human being about it. If anything, I'm probably paying attention to or trying to tune into skills of being a performer/communicator, being aware of what I'm doing, and trying to be effective in getting across.

H: In your years of schooling for your chosen profession, did you ever imagine yourself on stage, throwing out songs like "1978" (available on the Hale Music Sampler)?

N: Though I never "imagined" or "dreamed" per se, I've been in tune with what's going down.
